- It is the responsibility of each one of us to prevent the physical, sexual and emotional abuse of children and young people and to report any abuse discovered or suspected

- Manchester Diocese Mothers' Union is committed to supporting, resourcing and training those who work with children and young people and to providing supervision, where deemed applicable
- Manchester Diocese Mothers' Union is committed to following the guidelines and procedures published by the Diocese of Manchester in its document *"Safeguarding Children and Adults at Risk"* Manchester Diocese Handbook of Policy and Procedures November 2016
- > Manchester Diocese Mothers' Union will adopt good practice guidelines
- Each member working with children must undertake Diocesan Safeguarding Training, know the guidelines and undertake to follow them
- As part of our commitment to children and young people, Manchester Diocese Mothers' Union has appointed Christine Sharp to be the Safeguarding Co-ordinator
